Dear Mr. Corcoran,

I am replying at the request of the regional superior of the Sisters of Our Lady of Charity, Sister Sheila Murphy, to your letter of 19 August 2010, and the licence issued by your Department for the exhumation of 133 individuals from St. Mary's graveyard, High Park, Drumcondra, in 1993.

In November 2003, at the request of the Sisters of Our Lady of Charity, I agreed to investigate the matter of burial records of those women residents of High Park who had died while in the care of the Sisters (from 1853 onwards). I am a senior lecturer in history at NUI Maynooth, and for the purposes of my PhD thesis (published in 1998 as *Dublin slums 1800-1925, a study in urban geography*), I had utilised their Gloucester Street registers and so had some familiarity with their records and the general context within which they worked (founded 1853). The preparation of definitive lists was already in hand (from 1993), but it had become obvious that there were deficiencies, and as you rightly note, there were a number of discrepancies between the names on the exhumation licence, and the names on the memorial in Glasnevin cemetery. The Sisters of Our Lady of Charity were most anxious that the records be full and complete, and that all the women be correctly named, with the date of death, on an appropriate memorial, at the place where they were re-interred.

Before queries around deaths and burials (including exhumations and reburials) could be answered authoritatively, it was necessary to create an electronic database covering all women resident in High Park (from 1853 onwards) or in Gloucester Street / Sean Mac Dermott Street (from 1887 onwards). It was only with the completion of this database that it has been possible to sort out discrepancies; the repeated compilation of handwritten or typed lists had (from my perspective) muddied the waters, and it was necessary at all times to go back to the original manuscript sources.

burial records. I ought perhaps to add that I am attempting to complete an independent, scholarly history of the work of the sisters of Our Lady of Charity in Ireland, from 1853 to the 1970s, the final draft of which is to be with the publisher this September. The database is an essential component of this research. At a future date, yet to be decided, I will give a public lecture on the research background to the High Park graves, which will I think answer concerns about this long-drawn-out matter.

To return to the question of the licence issued by your Department for the exhumation of 133 individuals from St. Mary's graveyard, High Park, Drumcondra, in 1993, I have extracted from the High Park database the burial details of all the persons listed on that schedule. From this you will see how we have managed to resolve most cases where there was a discrepancy.

The Sisters of Our Lady of Charity have commissioned an appropriate memorial in Glasnevin Cemetery which will correct the discrepancies on the earlier memorial, and in addition will add the individual names, and dates, of all those women who were buried from High Park in Glasnevin Cemetery (as indeed most of their residents were; it was only the 'consecrates' who were ever buried in High Park). This will ensure that all are commemorated at the place where they are interred, as is only right. This memorial has been ready for erection for some months now, but was held up by some outstanding research queries which were resolved, to the best of my ability, this summer. I supplied the Sisters of Our Lady of Charity (on 17 August 2010) with a final list of all names and dates to be engraved. Your enquiry therefore is timely, and I hope this explanation answers your concerns. I will ask Sister Sheila Murphy to let you know in writing, for your own records, when the new memorial has been erected and blessed. This should be before the end of the year (2010).

Summary of research undertaken in connection with the women who died in St. Mary's, High Park, by Dr. Jacinta Prunty, senior lecturer in History, NUI Maynooth, County Kildare. Statement dated Thursday 1 April 2010

In November 2003, at the request of the Sisters of Our Lady of Charity, I, Jacinta Prunty, agreed to investigate the matter of burial records of those women residents of High Park who had died while in the care of the Sisters.

Before specific queries around deaths and burials (including exhumations and reburials) could be answered, it was necessary to create an electronic database covering all women resident in High Park (from 1853 onwards) or in Gloucester Street / Sean Mac Dermott Street (from 1887 onwards). This had already been started by Ms. Victoria (Vicky) Perry a professional archivist (UCD graduate) who worked on the database full-time from October 2003 to April 2004. Vicky entered the information found in the registers of entry for both houses, and supplemented by a number of other manuscript sources, such as sodality notebooks and annals.

This painstaking work was continued and expanded by me (J. Prunty) and by Ms. Maryann O'Connor, student archivist at NUI Maynooth (Sept. 2008 to present, April 2010). In particular, we followed up the matter of deaths and burials, undertaking searches in the General Register Office to procure copies of the death certificates of any persons for whom we did not already have that documentation. We were also assisted by Ms. Carmel O'Connell, a history graduate of NUI Maynooth, who worked in the records office of Glasnevin Cemetery on their interment registers (Oct. – Dec. 2005).

The total number of women residents on the High Park database from 1836 to 1989 comes to **6,026** (covers admissions from the Drumcondra asylum taken over by the sisters in 1853 through to admissions to Beechlawn up to 1989).

The total number of women residents on the Gloucester Street / Sean MacDermott Street database from 1876 to 1966 comes to **2,895** (covers admissions from the Gloucester Street asylum taken over by the sisters in 1887 through to 1966). The total therefore for both asylums is **8,921** residents, of whom **441** died between 1855 and 2009 (the majority of the deaths were in High Park, as most of the younger women were traditionally in Sean MacDermott Street).

About **5%** therefore of all the women who were resident in either asylum over that lengthy period continued there unto death. The overwhelming majority of women were short-stay residents, with a significant number returning on multiple occasions (even up to 9 times), which made the task of constructing the database a lot more complex.

The database work, including sorting out burial records, was undertaken in parallel with a major cataloguing project. All the historical records of the Sisters of Our Lady of Charity in Ireland were centralised in a secure archive at Beechlawn, and during the first stage (summer 2004), two student researchers (Michael Keyes and Alan Kelly, Department of History, NUI Maynooth) worked under the direction of Dr. Prunty (NUI Maynooth) and following the advice of Ms. Marianne Cosgrave (Mercy congregational archivist) to advance this project. The holdings have been described and arranged in a professional manner; in the case of High Park alone, the descriptive list runs to 287 pages, and can be searched electronically as well as in hardcopy (held at Beechlawn). That of Gloucester Street / Sean MacDermott Street has recently been completed by Maryann O'Connor and is also available in both electronic form and in hardcopy.

In the course of the catalogue project, a number of historical documents came to light that assisted in filling out the database of residents, and in particular answered queries around date of death, registration of death and place of burial. Perhaps the most significant of these (outside the registers and notebooks) were the following: death certificates, invoices and receipts for purchase of coffins and other burial expenses, obituaries, certificates or 'grants of right of burial' to numbered plots in Prospect (Glasnevin) Cemetery (with notes on who was buried in that particular plot), and correspondence with various parties (including the cemetery committee, the archbishop, benefactors, and within OLC). All of these items, along with the admission registers and allied notebooks, have been given archival reference numbers (see attached extract).

The first difficulty in the creation of a comprehensive database of all women residents in High Park and in Sean MacDermott Street, and in checking the registration of deaths, is the fact that on entry each woman was assigned a 'house name' by which she was known during her stay. If she left and returned a new name was usually issued. Some of the women left and re-entered several times and so had several house names. In addition, a small fraction of the women opted to stay as 'consecrates' and took what was a religious or consecrate name; when they died only their consecrate name, and the date of death, was inscribed on their headstones. For example:

██████████ entered aged 40 years 13 Oct. 1914, given name ██████████ entered again 5 June 1918, given name ██████████ consecrated name 'Magdalen of St. John', died 22 Nov. 1927

Some women used both their single and their married names. The first task of the researcher therefore was to ascertain all of the names an individual was known by, and when she entered/left/re-entered the asylum. The absence of death certificates for a number of residents which came to light in 2003 must firstly be put down to the lack of a single historical database of all residents. Full and accurate information was (and is) needed to secure a death certificate from the General Register Office (GRO), but regrettably insufficient or inaccurate information was supplied in a number of cases. The following are examples of the difficulties encountered:

Registration of deaths previous to 1864: as the GRO did not exist until 1864, no death certificates could be secured for persons buried before then (accounted for x8 deaths)

Problems with a very common name, and the number of persons registered under that name. For example, there are 127 persons named Mary [redacted] registered for 1887 alone, of whom about 30 died in the North Dublin registration district. In this case:

Nellie could be registered as Ellen, Eileen or Helen, depending on the clerk.

The above is a sample of the kind of problems encountered in this work, which would be familiar to anyone undertaking genealogical research.

The Sisters of Our Lady of Charity were scrupulous in registering the deaths of their residents and there is no reason whatsoever to believe that any person was ever buried from High Park or from Sean MacDermott Street without the fullest attention being given to this matter. The house names or consecrate names were never used to register the person's death.

As a professional academic with a long-standing involvement in historical research (PhD 1993), with considerable experience of directing research (having supervised I think x15 doctoral theses and c.60 Master's theses to date, and also several postdoctoral projects, and some hundreds of undergraduate projects and essays, in both UCD and now NUI Maynooth), I must state that the research in this matter has been pursued in so far as the records will allow.

All the draft notes surrounding this research, dating from 2003 onwards, are stored here in the archives at Beechlawn (reference: OLC1 / 8 / 1 no. 22), where I showed them to Detective Garda Martin Wall and Detective Garda Mick Mulligan when they visited on Thursday 25 March 2010. The original paper records which deal with admissions, deaths and burials, the GRO certificates, and the electronic database, are part of the archive and have their own catalogue numbers (as per enclosed extract). This coming week I will supply Sister Sheila Murphy, the regional superior of the Sisters of Our Lady of Charity in Ireland, with a final list of the names and dates of death of all the residents interred in Glasnevin, which I am happy to vouch is as full and accurate as is humanly possible.

I am currently completing an independent, scholarly history of the work of the sisters of Our Lady of Charity in Ireland, from 1853 to the 1970s, the final draft of which I hope will be with the publisher this summer (2010). In this book legitimate queries around St. Mary's Asylum, High Park and the Magdalen Asylum Gloucester Street / Sean MacDermott Street will be addressed, in particular the numbers of entrances, exits, length of stay, ages of residents, etc. The slow work of constructing an electronic database (of c. 9,000 women residents), and the professional arrangement and description of the historical records have delayed the completion of this work, but I look forward to being able to progress it without any further interruptions.
