Re: Exhumation of 133 bodies at Grove Ground, High Park Convent,  
Drumcondra.

Dear Sirs,

Further to your letter of the 16th ultimo, we submit now our tender for the work as outlined therein:

To exhume the said bodies from High Park, have them cremated and reinterred in Glasnevin Cemetery for the sum of £ 30,000.

In view of your request for a breakdown of the costs involved, the following may be of interest.

The charge for the work in High Park is £12,000. This includes erecting an twenty foot high screen around the site as directed by Dublin Corporation; the provision of a J.C.B. and any other necessary machinery; providing the prescribed formaldehyde, disinfectants and protective clothing; providing sufficient personnel to effect the exhumations.

The charge for supplying coffins is £ 7,750. These will number 133 approximately (@ £52.63 each) and will, where necessary, be of sufficient dimensions to accommodate disinterred damaged coffins within them. The coffins will be simple with no embellishments and suitable for cremation.

The difference in cost between earth burial for all and cremation is so great that, bearing in mind that your clients wish to keep costs to a minimum, the former is not really on the cards. I understand from the Crematorium authorities that the considered choice includes cremation for all with interment of ashes in two new graves. The cost for this is £ 6,750.

Transport, insurance, transport personnel, administration, security and incidental costs are £ 3,500. We would use a Transit van or similar for the transportation to Glasnevin.

We would be in a position to begin on receipt of two weeks notice, and we anticipate that the work will take about two weeks.
